Scott Erwin and Joanne Palmer talk about Contract and Grant Compliance at Colleges and Universities.

- The mission of standard colleges and universities is research, teaching, and public service. The mission of standard state and local schools is education, protection of citizens, and public service.
- The lifecycle of how a proposal becomes a contract: proposal idea, funding opportunities, proposal review, sponsor review, contract negotiation, project management.
- Types of contracts that colleges and universities may use: memorandum of understanding (MOU), interagency cooperation agreement, inter-local agreement, and subcontracts.
- Regulations that affect state agencies include OMB Circular A-87, A-102.
- Regulations that affect higher education include OMB Circular A-21, A-110, A-133, A-81.
- The purpose of the Data Act is to establish standards for data management access and control on colleges and universities. When establishing a contract questions regarding maintaining data integrity, how the data will be used, how data will be protected, and how access will be controlled should be considered.
- Contract negotiation points may include:
 - > Authority
 - ➤ Indemnification
 - Publication Rights
 - Data Rights
 - > Arbitration
 - > Insurance

- > Audit
- Payment
- Performance
- > Warranty
- > Intellectual Property
- > Termination Rights
